Why is the research being conducted?

The basis by which participants will be selected

Participants in this research should be adults (aged over 18), who have witnessed the public performance by migrant groups regarding their cultural heritage on **23 NOVEMBER 2025 at IAN HANGER RECITAL HALL, QUEENSLAND CONSERVATORIUM**. You do not need to be able to read English, but are ideally accompanied by a friend or relative or can translate (survey is written in English).

The expected benefits of the research

This research is expected to benefit migrant communities and cultural heritage industries by assisting them in identifying what important information is missing from Queensland heritage collections regarding specific migrant communities. The project will assist in connecting communities with heritage institutions as part of an ongoing relationship that may result in the preservation of culturally significant materials.
